Property Fraud Alert is a free service offered by the Clerk & Comptroller, Charlotte County, that helps the public protect their property from fraud by monitoring the documents being recorded in the Official Records of the Clerk's office.

This service only alerts subscribers of documents being recorded in the Charlotte County Official Records. You can sign up even if you don't own property in Charlotte County. In the event a document is recorded with the name you chose to monitor, you will receive an alert even if you don't own property in Charlotte County. This service only alerts subscribers of documents being recorded in the Charlotte County Official Records.

Fraud can be committed in a number of ways by recording documents in public records. For example, someone can create a fraudulent document that will deed your home to them and then record that document in the Official Records.

FDOT UPDATE - May 22, 2024

SR 777 River Road from I-75 to US 41: Embankment activities continue on southbound roadway from US 41 to West Villages Parkway. Drainage structures, pipe, curb and gutter, and gravity wall installations will also continue throughout the project. Signal, ITS, and lighting work is also on-going throughout the project. Daytime asphalt paving in various areas along the southbound roadway, including driveways and connecting streets from Center Road to the north. Nighttime asphalt paving of the River Rd. and Venice Avenue. Intersection, South bound River Road, and shared use path is tentatively scheduled to begin Monday night, May 27th, 2024, through Friday Morning, May 31st, 2024. Most paving will occur outside of current travel ways; however, flaggers will be used as necessary when operations impede on current travel lanes. NOAA PREDICTS ABOVE-NORMAL 2024 ATLANTIC HURRICANE SEASON

NOAA National Weather Service forecasters at the <u>Climate Prediction Center</u> predict above-normal hurricane activity in the Atlantic basin this year. NOAA's outlook for the 2024 Atlantic hurricane season, which spans from June 1 to November 30, predicts an 85% chance of an above-normal season, a 10% chance of a near-normal season and a 5% chance of a below-normal season.

As one of the strongest El Ninos ever observed nears its end, NOAA scientists predict a quick transition to <u>La Nina conditions</u>, <u>which are conducive to Atlantic hurricane activity</u> because La Nina tends to lessen wind shear in the tropics. At the same time, abundant oceanic heat content in the tropical Atlantic Ocean and Caribbean Sea creates more energy to fuel storm development.

NOAA's outlook is for overall seasonal activity and is not a landfall forecast. In addition to the Atlantic seasonal outlook, NOAA also issues seasonal hurricane outlooks for the <u>eastern Pacific</u>, <u>central Pacific</u> and <u>western north Pacific</u> hurricane basins.
